ABOUT THE SUMMER PROGRAM

The **PEF Summer Enrichment Program** mixes academic subjects with hands-on exploration to help prepare students for the upcoming year. The program serves incoming students Pre-K - 12 grade. Incoming pre-kindergarten, kindergarten and first grade students are offered a self-contained class that runs all 3 blocks. Students incoming to grades 2-8 have 3 blocks of engaging, fun-filled class. High school students can choose one block from any of the 3 sessions. Residence in the district or attendance at a PUSD school is not required. Non-PUSD students may be asked for immunizations records. Class sizes are limited to 20 students in most classes, and is first-come, first-served.

Whether new or returning, you will need an online account. This requires an email address. If you do not have an email address you must either create one, or visit our office in person to register.

③ If you are a returning customer you will need to use the same email address as last year to access your account. You be asked to create a new password this year. Otherwise you can just create a new account.

Class choices will appear based on the school location you choose. Incoming kindergarten and first grade students are only eligible for the self-contained classes. Students in grades 2-8 must choose three classes. High school students choose one class offering during any of the sessions.

④ Payments will be made online through a secure server, only via credit card. You can choose to pay in full, or enroll in our payment plan that will be semi-monthly payments on the 1st and 15th of every month though June 1st. A \$50 non-refundable handling fee will be retained. Cash and check payments must be made in person at our office. Classes are not held until deposit is received.

⑤ You're done! If you followed these steps then a welcome letter and class schedule will be mailed to you before the start of summer. A confirmation email and receipt will be sent to the email address you provide.

! After school programs must be registered for separately through the organization of your choosing, unless registering for PEF Afternoon Camp. You can find some recommendations on page 2 of this brochure.

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

You must meet the same income guidelines used by the free and reduced lunch program. If you choose to apply for a scholarship you must submit a \$50 deposit and agree to pay the balance through our payment plan, which will be 50-60% of the list tuition. Proof of income required by May 31st, and failure to submit will result in full tuition balance charged by June 1st.

WHAT'S NEW

Program hours have changed this year. The 3-block program will now be offered from 9:00 am – 1:15 pm. We will offer pre-care at 8:00 am for an additional \$50. The free breakfast program will start at 8:30, and lunch will be included in the main program. Be on the lookout for 40 new classes this year.

INTRO TO PRE-KINDERGARTEN, KINDERGARTEN AND FIRST GRADE

Locations Offered: Franklin, McKinley, Field Elementary

INTRODUCTION TO PRE-KINDERGARTEN

Designed to prepare students for school readiness by creating learning opportunities in language arts, mathematics, science, and in physical and social-emotional development. The inclusion of art and music will make learning fun!

*Students must be four years old by Sept. 1, 2018. **This class is only offered at McKinley***



INTRODUCTION TO KINDERGARTEN

Children prepare for kindergarten by engaging in language arts, mathematics, art, and music. This fun introduction enhances their readiness for both the social and academic settings of elementary school. *Students must be five years old by Sept. 1, 2018.*

INTRODUCTION TO FIRST GRADE

Designed to help ease the transition from kindergarten to 1st grade, students will have fun while engaging in thematic activities that reinforce reading and mathematics. As students are introduced to 1st grade curriculum, they will gain skills for academic success. *Students must be six years old by Sept. 1, 2018.*

LANGUAGE IMMERSION PROGRAMS

PEF offers courses designed to prepare students for PUSD's signature Dual Language Immersion Programs. Students can start the process of mastering Spanish, Mandarin, Chinese, or French. Priority will be given to students currently enrolled or who plan to enroll in the Dual Language Immersion Programs for the 2017-2018 school year.

DUAL LANGUAGE IMMERSION

[Mandarin] Joy of Cooking **

Through hands-on culinary exploration and the application of math and science, students are introduced to the joys of cooking and learn about nutrition. Each student will participate in the preparation of basic recipes from many cultures and, of course, taste their creations. **Students with food allergies should contact us before registering.
